Is the sponsoring organization reliable? *	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Is the organization's name prominent?</li> <li>Is there an <u>about us</u> link on the home page?</li> <li>What is the organization's reputation?</li> </ul>	Not Reliable (0pt)	Somewhat Reliable (3pts)	Highly Reliable (5 pts)
When was the information written & last updated?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Is there an update date listed at the top or bottom of the page?</li> <li>Is there a copyright date at the bottom?</li> </ul>	6 yrs or more (1pt)	3-5 years old (3pts)	2 yrs old or less (5 pts)
